INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather, and spend time reflecting and discussing about the gospel reading of the 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time. The Church has also dedicated this Sunday as the Fourth World Day of the Poor with the theme: "*Stretch forth your hand to the poor"* (*Sirach 7: 32*).

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of the 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time.

Heavenly Father, we have gathered here in the name of Jesus. Thank you for the wonderful gifts and talents you have given me. SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read from Matthew 25: 14-30.

(Then, reflect on these questions together as a family, and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the questions according to their children's level of understanding).

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES

Below you will find some activities for younger children, revolving around the Sunday Gospel. Select the activities you would like to complete with your children, or try to complete them all if you can!

GUIDE FOR PARENTS & GUARDIANS

Dear Parents and Guardians, we have included some tips for you as you facilitate these activities with your children. Each tip corresponds with the same numbered activity. Our hope is that these tips would help you in your endeavour to create a good learning experience for your children.

Activities #1 - #5

- Word-Find, crossword and coded activities help children to learn about, and associate certain words with key events in the Gospel.
- After your child has completed this activity, you may invite them to explore how these words are related to the readings of this week.
- When discussing definitions of key terms, you are encouraged to associate these terms not only with Gospel events, but with their own life experiences as well. This not only works to develop their vocabulary, but to also enable them to identify their feelings and emotions in specific ways.

Activity #6 & #7

- Many lessons could be taken from this activity. For example, this activity could spark a conversation about how our children could use what they have been given, for the glory of God and for the good of His kingdom. It would be beneficial to consider their *current capacity*, as well as their *potential* when brainstorming with them. Parents and guardians are encouraged to be mindful of, and build their children's sense of autonomy as they navigate their use of their gifts and talents given by God.
- You are encouraged to look beyond the activity, and to identify potential messages and meanings that could be turned into key learning moments for your child.

Activity #8 & #9

- Spot-the-difference & Colouring activities help children reinforce knowledge by giving content a *visual identity*. Children are encouraged through these activities to associate what they have learned with key scenes, and the emotions and feelings that spring from it. In this way, children take ownership of their knowledge.
- This week's activity covers the parable of the talents, where the first and second servants took the initiative to grow what they were

given, while the third servant did not. This is a great opportunity for our children to visualise the prosperity and goodness that flows from using our gifts and talents wisely, for God and His kingdom.

 Parents and guardians are encouraged to look beyond the activity, and to identify potential messages and meanings that could be turned into key learning moments for your child.


Activity #10



The master gave talents to his servants. He gave the more talents to the one who was his best servant. Find your way through the maze to the 5 talent bag.







Activity #10: Parable of the Ten Talents

Materials needed: 9" x 12" white paper, 3" x 12" yellow, orange, and blue (or any other colours) construction papers, crayons, glue, scissors.

- 1. Take the white paper.
- 2. Fold top edge down two inches.
- 3. Unfold.
- 4. Trace folded line with crayon. This is the background.
- 5. Write "Parable of the TALENTS" and "Matthew 25:14" in this top area.
- 6. Take the yellow, orange, and blue papers. These are the bags.
- 7. Fold yellow, orange and blue papers in half.
- 8. With folded side up, draw one 'bag' on each color.
- 9. Cut out three bags; one of each color.
- 10. Place bags evenly spaced on white paper under line.
- 11. Draw two lines between bags.
- 12. Glue one bag in each area, so the top folds up.
- 13. Draw string on each bag.
- 14. Write "5 talents" on the first bag.
- 15. Write "2 talents" on the second bag.
- 16. Write 1 talent" on the third bag.
- 17. Fold tops of bags up, making a crease in the 'string' area.
- Inside each bag, glue ONLY from folded edge to string area. (Don't glue the bag completely shut!)
- Inside the first bag, write "Well Done!" on the top of the bag and "10 talents!" on the bottom of the bag.
- 20. Inside the second bag, write "Well Done!" on the top of the bag and "5 talents!" on the bottom of the bag.
- Inside the third bag, write "Wicked and Lazy!" on the top of the bag and "1 talent" on the bottom of the bag.
- 22. Close bags.
- 23. Under the first bag AND the second bags, write "Enter into the JOY of your lord."
- 24. Under the third bag, write "Cast him into outer darkness."
