SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read from Mark 1: 40-45. Then, read the information below. Later, as a family reflect on the questions given and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding).

Some thoughts on today's scripture

- "Leprosy" is a term that covered a variety of skin diseases during Jesus' time. In Jewish law, a person suffering from any of these diseases made him or her "unclean". This is why lepers were often sent away or banished from society so that they may not infect others. Even their own family members avoided them.
- For Jesus to touch a leper was shocking to the Jews as he risks being considered to be "unclean" for he touched a man who was seen to be "unclean". But in this way, Jesus shows his closeness even those who are considered as "unclean" by society.
- This man must have been overjoyed with happiness because he was healed. He did the very thing Jesus asked him not to do! He spreads the word and witnesses to Jesus' goodness.
- 1. Who do you think are the people which our society today considered as "unclean"? Why are they seen as "unclean"?
- 2. How do you think the leper would have felt when people, including his family members, avoided or kept away from him because they considered him to be "unclean"? Imagine you were a leper during the time of Jesus. How would you have felt?
- 3. Jesus touched the leper although by the Jewish law, it would make him "unclean" too. Why did not Jesus follow the law? If you were a Jew at the time of Jesus, what would you have thought about Jesus?




Jesus Heals a Leper

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


